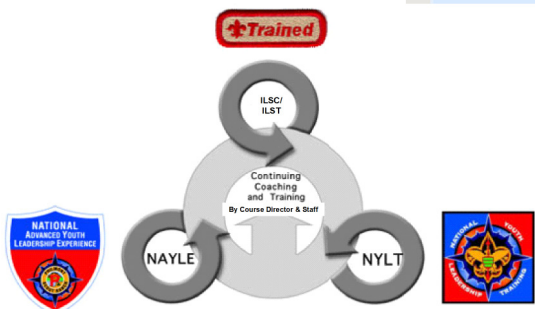


The Training Continuum of the Boy Scouts of America offers opportunities for youth members on three levels. Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops (ILST) and Introduction to Leadership Skills for Crews (ILSC) are offered on the unit level. They are conducted by the unit leader (Scoutmaster or Crew Advisor) and Senior Patrol Leader or Crew President as an introduction to the leadership roles of the youth members within the unit.



National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) is offered by the local council. Formerly Junior Leader Training (JLT), this newly redesigned course helps youth members learn the principles of leadership that are typically taught to top-level executives in Fortune 500 companies but at a fraction of the cost. The use of mnemonic devices (memory aids) helps to make the key points easily recalled when needed.

National Advanced Youth Leadership Experience (NAYLE) takes NYLT to the next level. Combining the principles of NYLT with a high adventure experience, NAYLE is offered by the National Council and conducted at Philmont Scout Ranch. Participants must have completed an NYLT course prior to applying for NAYLE.

THE FINE PRINT

The NYLT course will be conducted at Owasippe Scout Reservation, Twin Lake, Michigan. The course dates are July 22-27, 2012 or July 29-Aug. 3, 2012.

Applications with a paid deposit or full payment will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis until the course reaches a capacity of 48. Alternates will be placed on a stand-by list.

Detailed instructions, directions to camp, uniform requirements, personal equipment list, times, etc. will be available and discussed at a “pre-course” meeting or mailed to you if you cannot attend the meeting.

FEE: \$200.00 total cost. (\$20 discount if paid in full by June 1, 2012) A \$50.00 deposit is required to reserve your spot on the course. This cost includes all instructional materials, food and special equipment. There are NO hidden fees!

Deposit is due with application, then monthly payments until balance is paid in full. Cancellations prior to July 6th will receive a full refund less \$50 deposit. Cancellations after July 6th will not receive any refund!

National Youth Leadership Training

COURSE DESCRIPTION

The National Youth Leadership Training course centers around the concepts of what a leader must **BE**, what he must **KNOW**, and what he must **DO**. The key elements are then taught with a clear focus on HOW TO. The skills come alive during the week as the patrol goes on a Quest for the Meaning of Leadership.

NYLT is a six-day course. Content is delivered in a unit and team outdoor setting with an emphasis on immediate application of learning in a fun environment. Interconnecting concepts and work processes are introduced early, built upon, and aided by the use of memory aids, which allows participants to understand and employ the leadership skills much faster.

NYLT is an exciting, action-packed program designed for councils to provide youth members with leadership skills and experience they can use in their home units and in other situations demanding leadership of self and others.

Built on the legacy of past JLT successes, the new NYLT integrates the best of modern leadership theory with the traditional strengths of the Scouting experience. Through activities, presentations, challenges, discussions, and audio-visual support, NYLT participants will be engaged in a unified approach to leadership that will give them the skill and confidence to lead well. Through a wide range of activities, games, and adventures, participants will work and play together as they put into action the best Scouting has to offer.

Who May Attend

An NYLT course is ideal for training senior patrol leaders, patrol leaders, and Venturing Crew officers. It can also be a valuable experience for older scouts. In order to attend an NYLT course, an applicant must have the following qualifications by the beginning of the course:

BOY SCOUT

- Be 13 years of age or have completed the 7th grade, be a First Class Scout and have a Scoutmaster's recommendation.

VENTURER

- Be 14 years of age, be experienced living outdoors and have the Crew Advisor's recommendation.
